Happy New Year from the Commission on Ministry. Did you know that North Carolina was the first region among Disciples of Christ to establish a Commission on Ministry and, offers the longest continuing guidance with regards to the order of ministry (1859-present)?

We are a group of twelve lay and clergy men and women (plus the Regional Minister) who help the region live into the Disciples order of ministry document, upon which the 2016 edition of our regional Order of Ministry document is based. We usually meet in the Regional Office on the first Tuesday of January, March, May, July, September, and November, but flex some dates due to holidays. When we meet we typically see between seven and nine candidates for ministry or commissioned ministers making their periodic visits. NC has approximately sixty-five people who fit in these two categories, plus dozens of ordained ministers who are no longer required to regularly check-in with the COM.

The following Disciples are currently serving on the Commission on Ministry: Acting Regional Minister Bishop Valerie Melvin, Rev. Dr. Laura Johnson (Chair), Rev. David Mallory (Vice-Chair), Mr. Horace Williams, Rev. Dr. Jackie McHenry, Mr. Reed Davis, Rev. Dr. Lea Slaton, Rev. Dr. Rick Harrison, Ms. Ann Kwasnick, and Rev. Louis Threatt. Some members rotated off the commission in January 2017, and we are in the process of naming the three newest members.

In 2016, the Regional Assembly approved the revised Commission on Ministry Order of Ministry document. If you need a copy of this document, please contact me at revlaura@nc.rr.com or the regional office.

Rev. John Richardson led the Boundaries I and Boundaries II training sessions in 2016. The Commission on Ministry will soon check the list of participants to ensure that every NC minister completed one of the Boundaries courses. We require this course to be retaken every five years. If you are commissioned or ordained, and you did not have an opportunity to take the course in 2016, please contact me. The makeup date is April 28, 2017 (registration form on p2).

The Regional Assembly approved the resolution that we co-sponsored along with the Commission on Reconciliation and Anti-Racism to require ministers to take anti-racism/pro-reconciliation class every three years for continuing education. We are currently identifying course materials and instructors for this course and hope to offer it in 2017.

According to a document written by Dr. Allan R. Sharp, in 1915 the commission on ministry (then named the Committee on Ordination) informed the "Convention" meeting at Atlantic Christian College that they examined five qualities of a candidate considering ordination: Faith in Jesus, Knowledge of the Gospel and confidence in the word of God, Adaptability, Motive, and Willingness to endure hardness as a good soldier of Jesus Christ

Today, we certainly realize that ministry can be challenging, thus our prayer for all ministers and churches as we enter 2017 has a special emphasis on the number five of the historical list. Lord, may it not be necessary that ministers and churches experience difficulties, but if they must, may they endure and achieve unity and wholeness. Make us all adaptable and give us all proper motives—lives centered in Christ Jesus in whom we have trust and whose word we seek to faithfully proclaim. Amen.

Special meetings Updates: The DWM "Women's Day Apart" retreat is planned and ready for March 10-11. At the beginning of the week, I met with a volunteer to begin looking into an integrated marketing plan to help evaluate and streamline our communications and better optimize our rentals year-round. Later in the week, I confirmed with leaders of The Lions Club of whom are seeking a place to begin a Pamlico chapter that we will host several of their leaders this spring, with the possibility of regular meetings housed here in the future. CycleNC which rides in and around Oriental has several cyclists beginning to book Camp Caroline for lodging and some food provisions while they ride all over Eastern NC. I am excited to host The Emmaus Walk team as they are having a planning retreat this spring before the men's and women's pilgrimages. Friday, I met with Rev. Dr. Robert Cayton, his wife Rose, and a couple of lead organizers with National Grange to be considered for a camping and retreat location for many of their youth and young adult development programs.

Physical and Programmatic Updates: We are having electricians bid on electrical upgrades to Latham House, Pelican's Rest, and each Cabin. We have had two internet service providers come to camp to begin looking at better wireless coverage in many meeting spaces and rentals at Camp Caroline. Several volunteers have come this week to help tend to property and help organize office spaces as well as help design a "resource room" established in the Lee Building for Camp Director and Camp staff support throughout the year. All of the pilings at the pier along the walkway have now been replaced and new support headers have been added for structural support. Community Pickleball continues to grow in interest and people, and this week we added two extra days to the Pickleball calendar, so we now have Pickleball opportunities 5 days/week. Thank you all for your continued prayers and support of the many ministries of Camp Caroline.


