#### The E.G. Purcell, Jr. Bible Conference Lecture

**Dr. Jerry L. Sumney** is the Professor of Biblical Studies, Lexington Theological Seminary in Lexington, KY. Dr Sumney received his B.A. at David Lipscomb University; M.A. from Harding University; and Ph.D. from Southern Methodist University.

He is a member of the Society of Biblical Literature and is past president for the Southeastern Region of the Society. At the national level, he also served as the chair of the steering committee for the Theology of the Disputed Paulines Group and as the chair of the steering committee for the Disputed Paulines Section. He also chaired the Pauline Epistles and Literature Section of the International Meeting of the SBL. He was elected to membership in the Studiorum Novi Testamenti Societas (SNTS) in 2005.

Dr. Sumney has written seven books and is currently working on a book on Paul's use of tradition, a commentary on 1 Corinthians, and the Bible study section of an issue of the *New International Sunday School Lesson Annual*. Sumney has presented papers at regional, national, and international academic conferences. He has also led numerous workshops for elders and deacons, and Bible study workshops and series, including in the Lay School of Theology at LTS and in the school for licensed ministers sponsored by the Kentucky region of the Christian Church. Dr. Sumney and his wife, Diane, have three daughters.

## The Thedford G. & Woodrow W. Sprinkle Lecture

**The Rev. Dr. William J. Barber II** is the Pastor of Greenleaf Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Goldsboro, NC. Dr. Barber received his bachelor's degree in political science from NCCU, cum laude; Master of Divinity degree from Duke University; and a doctorate from Drew University with a concentration in policy and pastoral care.

A highly sought after speaker, he has keynoted hundreds of national and state conferences, including the 2016 Democratic National Convention. He has spoken to a wide variety of audiences including national unions, fraternities and sororities, motorcycle organizations, drug dealer conferences, women's groups, economic policy voting rights, LGBTQ groups, environmental and criminal justice groups, small organizing committees of domestic workers, fast food workers, Christians, Muslims, Jews, atheists and others.

He has served as president of the North Carolina NAACP, the largest state conference in the South, since 2006 and sits on the National NAACP Board of Directors.
