The Operating Fund deficit as of 9/30/2019 is \$61,244. We anticipate approximately \$26,896 of year end transfers from other funds which will partially cover this deficit. This includes transfers from

(1) the various Scholarship Funds for camper fees, (2) the Carawan Horne Fund for new camp programming for youth and/or senior adults, and (3) the Development Fund for camp capital expenditures (over \$500).

As we see here, Camp Caroline typically has a low income month in September, and September was also the month that Hurricane Dorian impacted the camp. (We are grateful to the many volunteers who helped get the camp back in operating condition so quickly!) Fortunately, as hoped, the General & Program operating income was up in September over the previous two months.

Please give prayerful consideration to making a donation to the Region's annual appeal currently in process. We are the church, together!

Reminders for All Commissioned and Ordained Ministers Regarding Housing Allowance and Other Clergy Financial Info

Sometimes when we commission and ordain ministers, we forget to tell them about the new IRS waters they're entering. All commissioned (aka licensed) and ordained ministers with Disciples standing who are employees of a congregation (and some other employers) have the privileges and responsibilities of clergy with regard to the IRS. Sometimes churches, ministers, and even some accountants misunderstand this and think clergy tax categorization is optional. The church cannot pay the employer's portion of a minister's social security—and that's true both for commissioned and for ordained clergy.

Each year the Disciples Pension Fund publishes a useful resource regarding clergy taxes just to help you, and you can download this for free. Here's a link to the page where you can find the tax guide: https://pensionfund.org/resources/guides-and-factsheets . You might want to give it to your accountant.

This is important information to embrace now because the declaration of the specific dollar amount of clergy housing allowance (for which you pay

social security tax—both yours and the employer's portion—but not income tax) must be done in the previous year in an official business meeting of the congregation. Therefore, for 2020 clergy housing allowance to be allowable, the figure needs to be approved at a church business meeting before December 31, 2019. (You cannot change the amount in 2020.) You can learn a lot more about these financial facts. Clergy and congregants can benefit in many other ways from reading the Church Treasurer's Handbook distributed for free by the Christian Church Foundation: https://static1.squarespace.com/static/58fod94ccdof68deb245c6bc/t/59122b4c725e25a34efd7053/1494362962916/ccf-resource-treasurers-handbook.pdf. Please do read it—someone needs to be the resident expert on these matters because they are important, and financial accuracy and transparency helps grow the church.

As a reminder, it's also useful for all clergy to update their contract with the church using the Pension Fund's annual call renewal form. The clergy person keeps the original, the church keeps a copy, and copies are also mailed to the regional minister and to the Disciples Home Missions Office of Search and Call. This keeps everyone on the same page. You can download the form here: http://disciples.org/wp-content/uploads/2015/04/Letter_of_Call_annual-english.pdf

Finally, please church leaders and clergy—permit and encourage all Disciples church employees to participate in the Disciples Pension Fund (which is not only for pastors but for all Disciples employees who earn at least \$150/month). Disciples Pension Fund offers a true pension plan, such as existed for the blue chip company employees back in the good old days, along with other IRAs, TDRAs, and savings plans. The Pension Fund is one of the ways that Disciples churches can serve their pastors and eligible employees (and NOW THEIR SPOUSES, TOO) who tirelessly give so much to help the church in fulfilling Jesus' mission every day.







Dear NC Disciples Women:

We are delighted to share with you the 2020 Woman-to-Woman Scholarship Application, along with a form to use for colleague and minister recommendations. If you have an interest in being the North Carolina Woman-to-Woman representative to **SOUTHERN ASIA, October 24 – November 7, 2020,** please fill out the appropriate forms and return them to the Regional Office no later than **December 31,** so that we might select the NC delegate and forward our recommendation to Indianapolis by **February 15th**. A member of the regional Woman-to-Woman committee or a previous Woman-to-Woman delegate is available to talk with each applicant personally to insure understanding of the Covenant Agreement in regard to international travels.

To complete the application process, read the guidelines for travel very carefully then secure a Recommendation from your <u>current</u> minister and a colleague. Advise them to return the form promptly. <u>December 31</u> is the deadline. The number of women allowed on the trip abroad is usually limited, so the sooner we receive your application and recommendations, the sooner we can choose a representative and pass that name on to the Office of Disciples Women in Indianapolis. Please do not send an application to the ODW without going through the NC process first, they will send it back to us!

The approximate cost for the trip is \$5,000.00 (not including personal airfare to/from city of departure). Your NC DWM/CWF works to fund this trip, the applicant chosen is encouraged to raise funds as well. Local congregations and mission-minded organizations are always willing to help underwrite the trip. Some Woman-to-Woman delegates in the past have not had the money for such a trip but through the kindness of others, God made the way possible for them to travel. Go ahead and apply, you might end up with two stories to tell; 1) about the amazing benevolence of God and, 2) about how trust and faith are key ingredients for a miracle.

After the trip, you will be asked to fulfill your part of the Woman-to-Woman covenant agreement, which is to prepare and present a program to churches in the Region of North Carolina. These presentations will begin <u>April of 2020</u> and end <u>April 2021</u>. This is traditionally when the DWM/CWF study material will include the country you visited as its mission emphasis. We will publish your logistical information throughout the region and the DWM/CWF's will contact you to arrange a time for a presentation. We highly encourage the churches to provide you with a place to stay if an overnight stay is necessary and pay your mileage at the CPI approved rate. When honorariums are given, they are remitted to the Regional office to replenish the Woman-to-Woman travel fund which will offer another woman an opportunity such as yours.

According to our former Woman-to-Woman representatives, experiencing Christianity in

another culture is life-changing. Please give this your prayerful consideration.

Application Timeline from the Office of Disciples Women:

February 15 – Application is due.

March 1 – Notice of Acceptance to participants and regional staff.

May 1 – Deposit of \$600 AND two copies of pages 1 & 2 of Passport due.

June 1 – 1/3 of balance of the registration fee is due and deposit is non-refundable. *Cancellations after this point are subject to airfare and hotel cancellation penalties.*

July 15 – $\frac{1}{2}$ of remaining balance of the registration fee is due.

August 15 – The balance due must be paid by August 15


