MINUTES of the 172nd Regional Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in North Carolina June 6, 2020 Via Video Conference

The business session began at 10:00 a.m.

Opening Prayer by Bishop Valerie Melvin

Purpose of Gathering Virtually: Rev. Karen Kelly, Regional Board Secretary

As a result of the state and national restrictions on mass gatherings due to the coronavirus, the Regional Board had a special called meeting via video conference on April 8, 2020 and approved the cancelation of the planned weekend Regional Assembly in April.

Because some business of the Region must be conducted, the Regional Board approved this virtual gathering for a shortened business session of the Regional Assembly.

Moderator's Opening Remarks and Call to Order

The moderator opened with a brief welcome and thanksgiving to executive committee, and Rev. Dr. Laura Johnson as chair of COM.

District court Judge Darrell Cayton was recognized as parliamentarian.

The moderator gave a brief progress report of her tenure in office including the establishment of the Regional Elders program, establishment of the Design review committee, continued financial progress, and review of churches listed in the Year-Book.

Delegates were reminded that there are no other items of business except as presented, and that discussion and question opportunities had already been provided for during a scheduled question and answer session with the executive committee.

Presentation of Business Items

The Moderator read the two Resolutions on the Business Session Agenda, the recommendation for election of Commission on Ministry nominees, and the election of Regional Officers.

A vote from the delegates was taken by poll and a voice roll call of 6 members who had phoned in was taken. With 81% voting the tally was recorded by the Secretary:

Business Item 1: Passed. 71 yes; 5 no; 2 abstentions

Business Item 2: Passed. 78 yes; 5 no. Business Item 3: Passed. 78 yes Business Item 4: Passed 78 yes





The Treasurer's Report

If you are like me, in a good news/bad news situation, you like to get the bad news first. So here it is: as of May 31, the Operating Fund of the region had incurred a loss of \$52, 511. However, I want to be quick to add that this was not unexpected, and was largely a consequence of the coronavirus pandemic.

The Executive Committee closed Camp Caroline on March 14, and re-opened it on a limited basis only a few days ago, on June 15. At all times, we have fully complied with the Governor's orders, and we will continue to do so as the camp gradually re-opens. While Casey Perry, our camp manager, worked hard to hold spending to a minimum for the three months the camp was closed, there were routine maintenance costs such as utilities, which had to be held at a level that would prevent mold in the cabins and other buildings, along with repairs necessary to fix leaking roofs, etc. Salaries for year-round staff had to be paid as well, though none of the seasonal staff have been called to work as of this writing. In short, we were faced with little to no revenue and ongoing expenditures at the camp.

The Executive Committee also recognized that there would be a "domino effect" impacting DMF giving, which is the largest source of income for the General portion of the Operating Fund. That is, due to the large number of people laid off or furloughed from their jobs, many individuals were forced to decrease their giving to their congregation, which in turn impacted the ability of congregations to keep up their DMF giving. And in fact, DMF giving from January – May of 2020 was \$14K less than in 2019.

Efforts to hold expenses down kept the deficit from being much larger. All staff travel has been eliminated, with the only exception to allow our Regional Minister to make emergency pastoral care calls. Staff were asked to contact either the Regional Minister or the Treasurer prior to incurring any expenses outside of a revised "bare bones" budget which the Executive Committee constructed in March. In early May, staff were prepared for possible furloughs or cuts in hours as of June 1. Our staff took all of this in stride and kept on making sure that the ministry of the region would not suffer.

Time for the good news! We had applied as early as possible for a Paycheck Protection Program government loan. The loan came through, just in time to avoid any reductions in year-round staff. We will soon be able to apply for forgiveness of the loan, and we fully expect the entire loan of \$56K to be forgiven. That will then offset the current deficit with a bit of room to spare.

We were also blessed with the receipt of just over \$20K from FEMA, related to costs at Camp Caroline after Hurricane Florence in the fall of 2018. That FEMA grant was received and reported in Camp Caroline's operating income in March of this year.

Last but definitely not least, we are very grateful to those individuals and congregations who have been able to help support the region with donations despite the current economy. We received just over \$11K in response to the "Remaining Generous" campaign, and there were additional individual gifts to the region of more than \$13K. DMF giving, though down, was stronger than expected, totaling not quite \$45K. And there have been donations totaling almost \$25K designated for the camp's operations as well!

For me, the biggest disappointment was having to not only close the camp, but to cancel the regular summer camp season for our children and youth. The high point came when our PPP loan was approved, so that we could keep our year-round staff working. We know there are months to go before we can relax and say "we made it" through the pandemic in good shape financially. But for the month of May, income exceeded expenses by \$6K, and that is cause for celebration!

Please continue to give generously as you are able. Please pray for your region's leaders and staff as we navigate these uncharted waters. And may we all thank God for the many ways we have been blessed.

My heart was formulating another message, born out of my relationship with God and neighbor, not anxiety and panic.

So I asked, how will I be able to give? I was met with the non-anxious presence of the Holy Spirit and calmly reassured, "all will be well." Beloveds, how our God operates, and why things turn out the way they do, are far above my pay grade. However, I have walked as a Christian long enough to realize that a primary component of Christianity is trusting the one who has my heart! Each time I believe God, and accept another invitation to support ministry, even when it doesn't quite make sense, I am amazed at how things turn out. I invite you to join me and trust God with the tender places in your heart, the chaos of these days, the promise for your future, and giving to Disciples Mission Fund.
