Claretta suggested we pray as we began our retreat.

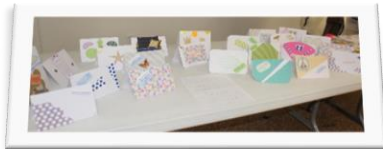
